EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITIES:

BASIC COSMETOLOGY: Hairstylist, Color Specialist, Manicurist, Esthetician, Product salesperson/Manufacturers representative, Makeup artist, Wax or Brow Specialist, Platform Artist.

ESTHETICIAN: Esthetician, Product salesperson/Manufacturers representative, Makeup artist, Wax or Brow Specialist, Platform Artist.

MANICURIST: Manicurist, Nail Technician; Product salesperson/Manufacturers representative/Nail Product Company; Platform Artist/Educator/Nail Product Company.

MASTER INSTRUCTOR: Educator in Public and Private Schools, Educator for Beauty Product Companies; Educator for Salons or any of the jobs listed for Basic Cosmetologists, Estheticians, or Manicurists.

COMPENSATION for all courses is variable and dependent on several factors including but not limited to:

1. Location
2. Caliber of Establishment
3. Clientele
4. Skill and Experience
5. Hours and Times Worked

ACCORDING TO THE NACCAS 2008 NATIONAL JOB DEMAND SURVEY, IN 2008 AVERAGE FULL-TIME SALARIES FOR ALL SALON PROFESSIONALS, INCLUSIVE OF TIPS WAS \$37,962.

PHYSICAL DEMANDS

Basic Cosmetology, Esthetician, Manicurist and Master Instructor employment is physically demanding. Most services require standing or sitting for varying periods of time putting stress on hands, back, feet and legs.

SAFETY

Basic Cosmetologists, Estheticians, Manicurists and Master Instructors may use potentially hazardous chemical products which require strict adherence to safety procedures. MSDS sheets provided by manufacturers, for each product used are available. These sheets record what to do in an emergency situation if the product affects customers or the beauty professional. In some instances, Basic Cosmetologists, Estheticians, Manicurists and Master Instructors may develop sensitivities to certain products making it difficult or impossible to remain in the field.

BROKEN ARROW BEAUTY COLLEGE statistics for Calendar Year 2018 (Jan 1, 2018 to Dec 31, 2018) are:

70.23% of the students scheduled to graduate in that year went on to graduate.

69.23% of the students scheduled to graduate in that calendar year and who went on to graduate found employment in the cosmetology field. Some graduates may not have responded to our inquiries, so we do not know whether they found employment or not.

81.82% of the students who graduated and sat for all portions of the licensure examination passed the examination.

LICENSING REQUIREMENTS

All Basic Cosmetologists, Estheticians, Manicurists and Master Instructor graduates must be licensed by the Oklahoma State Board of Cosmetology and Barbering in order to hold employment. Upon completion of the program requirements, students in Basic Cosmetology, Esthetician, Manicurist, and Master Instructor courses will be eligible to take the Oklahoma State Board of Cosmetology and Barbering written and practical examinations. Basic Cosmetologists, Estheticians, Manicurists, Master Instructor graduates will be eligible for their license after successfully completing both the practical and written exams with a grade of 75% or higher on each portion.
